**Application for consent under Section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989 (as amended) and a Marine Licence under Part 4 of the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010 to construct and operate a demonstration Tidal Array in the Sound of Islay and a direction that Planning Permission for the onshore development be deemed to be granted.**

Thank you for your letter of 26 May 2014 seeking our comments on the above application and environmental statement addendum. Our comments here concentrate on our statutory remit for scheduled monuments and their setting, category A listed buildings and their setting and gardens and designed landscapes and battlefields appearing in their respective Inventories.

I note that the historic environment baseline for the assessment has been reviewed and that no alterations to this baseline were identified. The updated environmental statement therefore considers the 2010 assessment to remain valid. I am content to agree with this and have no further comments to add to those issued previously in response to the original assessment.
