Notice has previously been given that Moray Offshore Windfarm (West) Limited (“Moray West”), registered under company registration 10515140 at 14-18 City Road, Cardiff, CF24 3DL, has applied to the Scottish Ministers for:

- consent under section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989; and
- marine licence(s) under section 20 of the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010 and section 65 of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009.

to construct and operate an Offshore Wind Farm at the Moray West Site, located on the Smith Bank in the Outer Moray Firth, approximately 22.5 km from the Caithness Coastline, with a total area of approximately 225 km<sup>2</sup> (central latitude and longitude co-ordinates: 58°5.827' N 3°0.417' W (WGS84)) and associated Offshore Transmission Infrastructure (the “Applications”).

The proposed generating station would comprise of up to 85 wind turbine generators with a maximum blade tip height of 285 metres above Highest Astronomical Tide.

Before deciding the Applications the Scottish Ministers will decide whether it is necessary to carry out an Appropriate Assessment under the above Regulations. To inform this decision, Moray West submitted a Report to Inform an Appropriate Assessment (RIAA) as part of the Applications.

Notice is hereby given that Moray West has now submitted new information (including some corrections to the information previously submitted) to the Scottish Ministers to inform an Appropriate Assessment.

Representations should be dated and should clearly state the name (in block capitals) and the full return email or postal address of those making representation.

Having considered the Applications and other information received, in conjunction with any representations received, the Scottish Ministers may:-

- Consent to the proposed development, with or without conditions attached; or
- Reject the proposed development.

**All previous representations received in relation to this development will be considered.**

#### Fair Processing Notice

MS-LOT determine applications for marine licences under Part 4 of the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010 and Part 4 of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009 and applications for section 36 consents under The Electricity Act (as amended). During the consultation process any person having an interest in the outcome of the application may make representation to MS-LOT. The representation may contain personal information, for example a name or address. This representation will only be used for the purpose of determining an application and will be stored securely in the Scottish Government's official corporate record.
