The erection of these two vast Offshore Arrays threaten the natural environment of the Firth of Forth. It will critically endanger the sea bird colonies on the Bass Rock and Fair Isle. These birds travel within the basin searching for food and these arrays will lead to deaths and food shortages. Their routes to and from feeding grounds must be protected. In addition this work will threaten the survival of the local dolphins and the whales that traverse these waters. We must protect foraging seabirds which are already suffering catastrophic declines. These colonies are globally significant and must be looked after and not destroyed by these machines.
