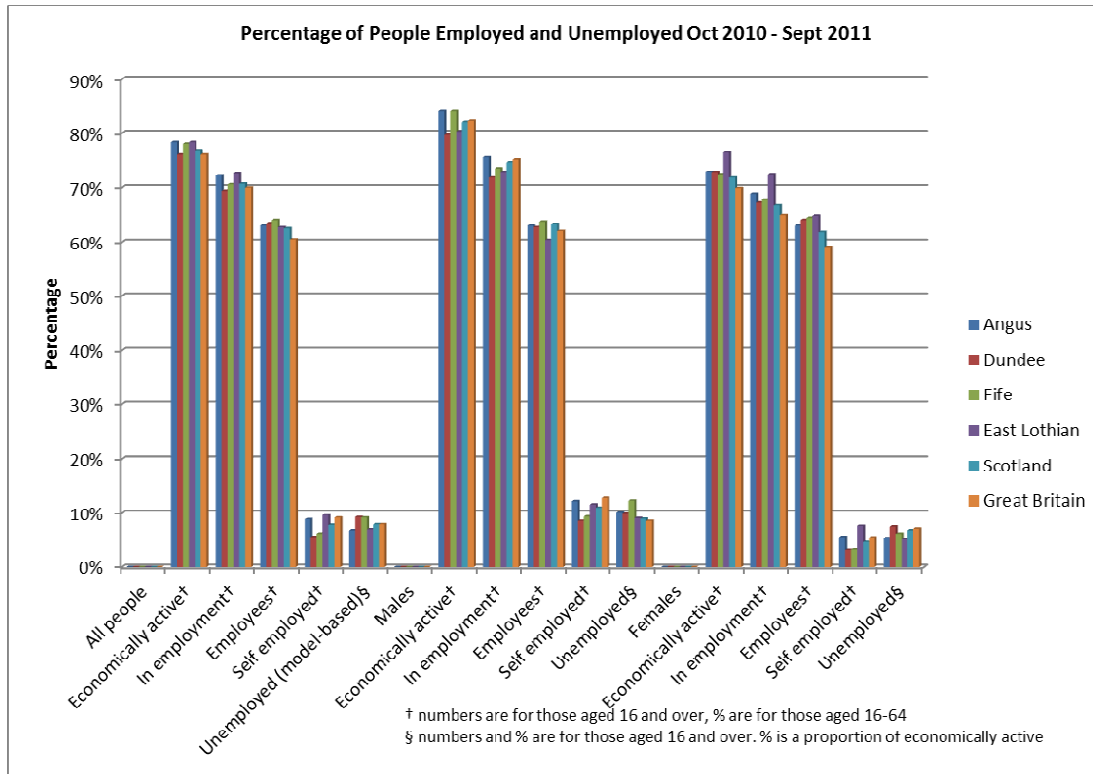

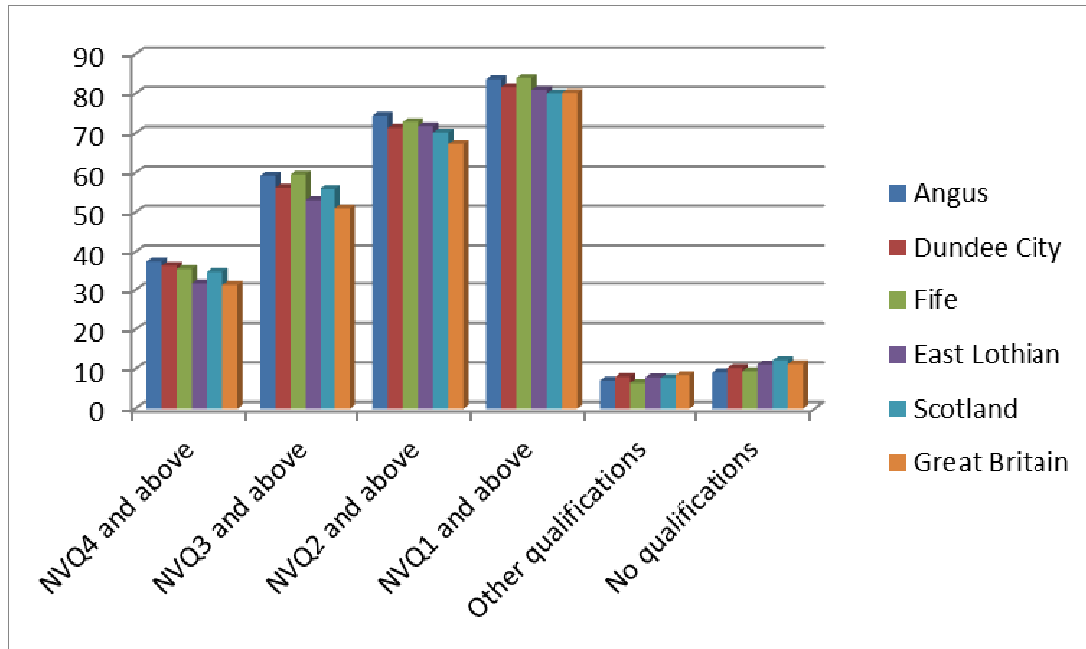

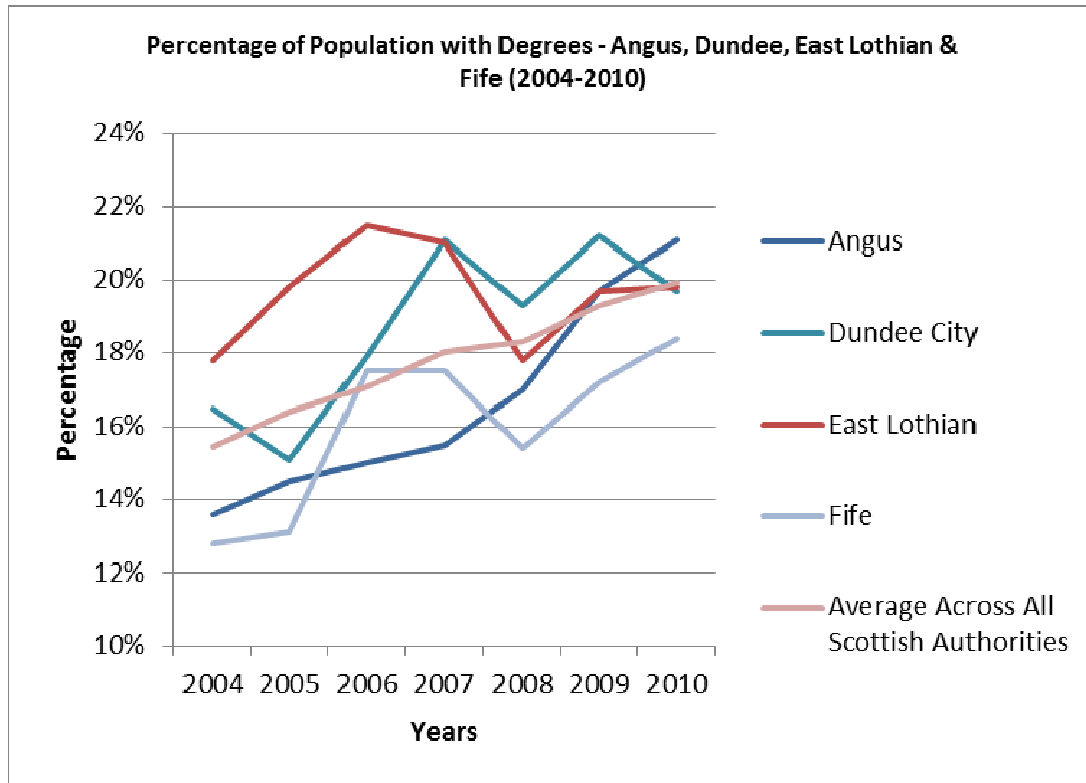

Plot 2: Angus, Dundee City, Fife & East Lothian – Qualifications by Percentage Population



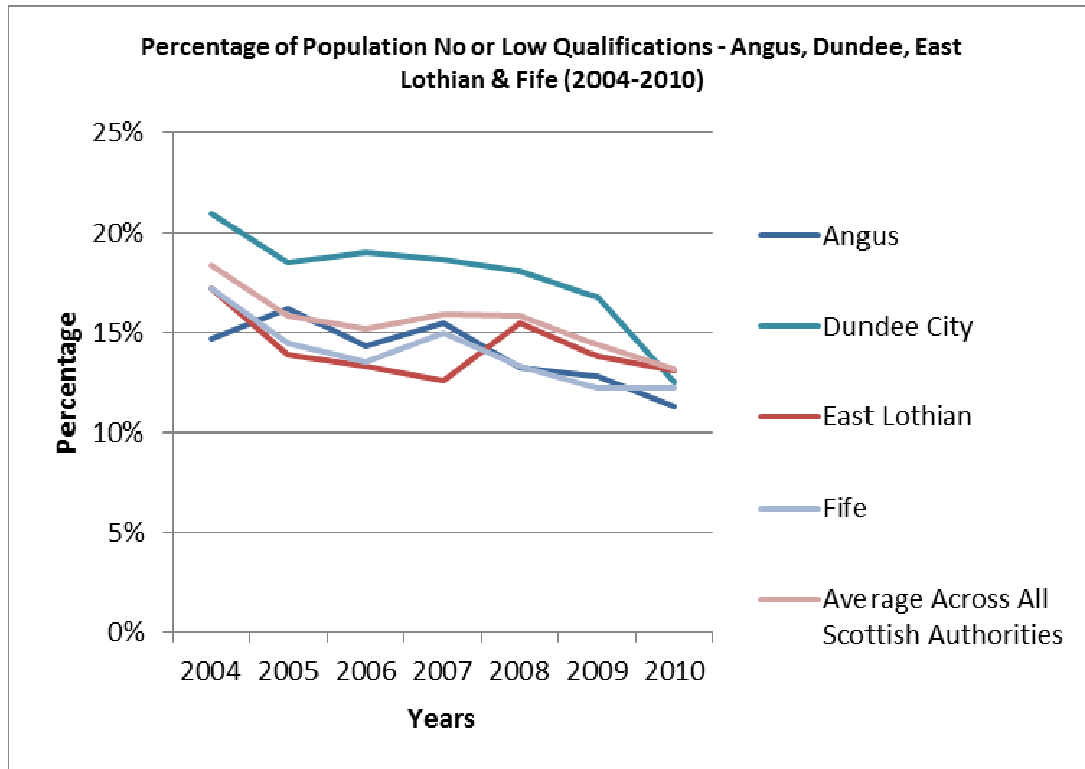

Plot 3: Angus, Dundee City, Fife, East Lothian & Average Across All Authorities – Percentage of Population with Degree Qualifications



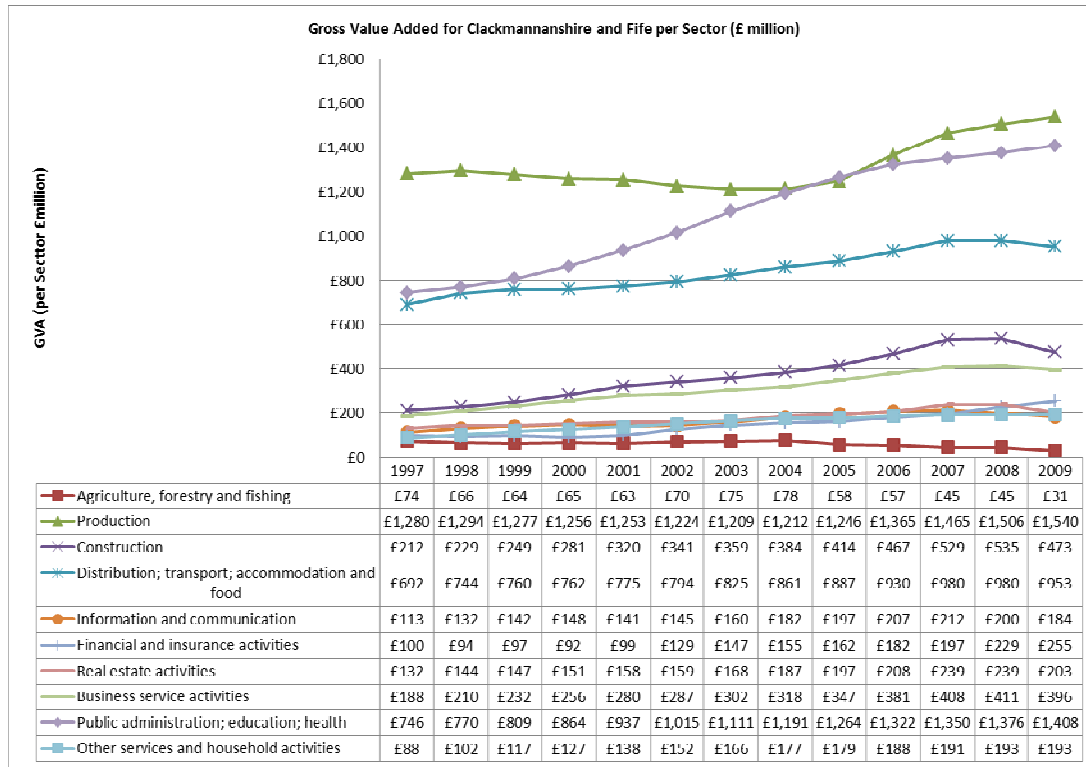

Plot 4: Angus, Dundee City, Fife, East Lothian & Average Across All Authorities – Percentage of Population with No or Low Qualifications



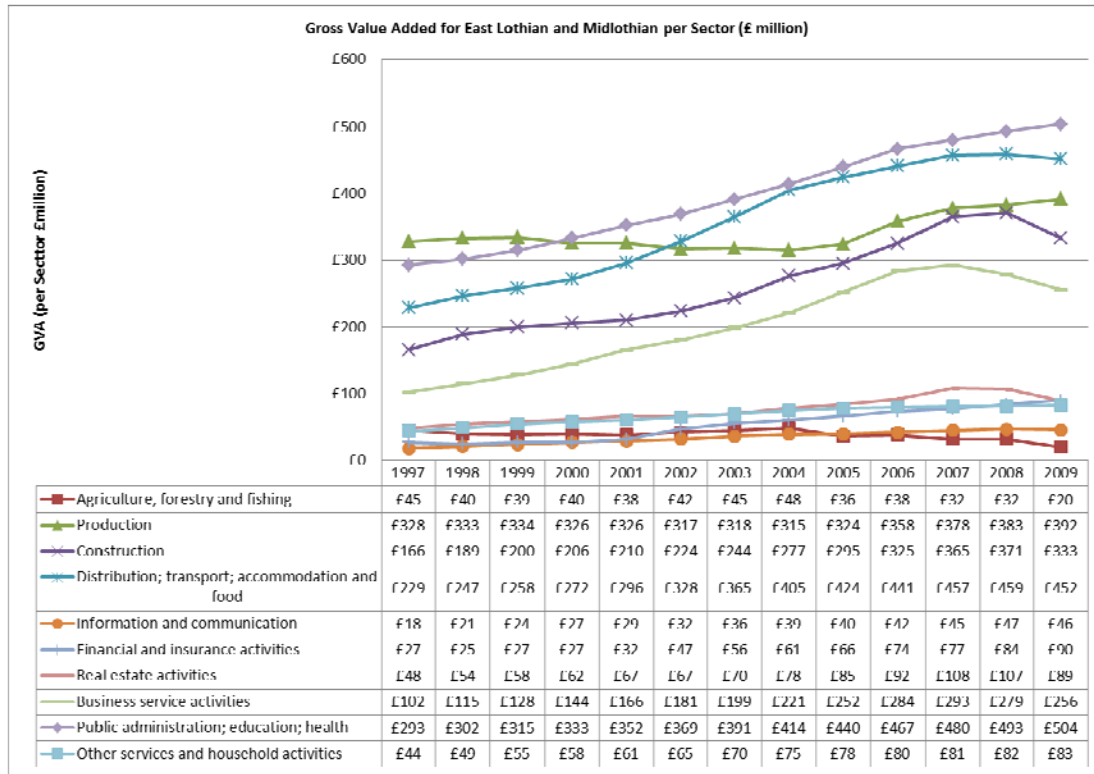

Plot 5: Gross Value Added (GVA) for Clackmannanshire and Fife per Business Sector (1997 to 2009)



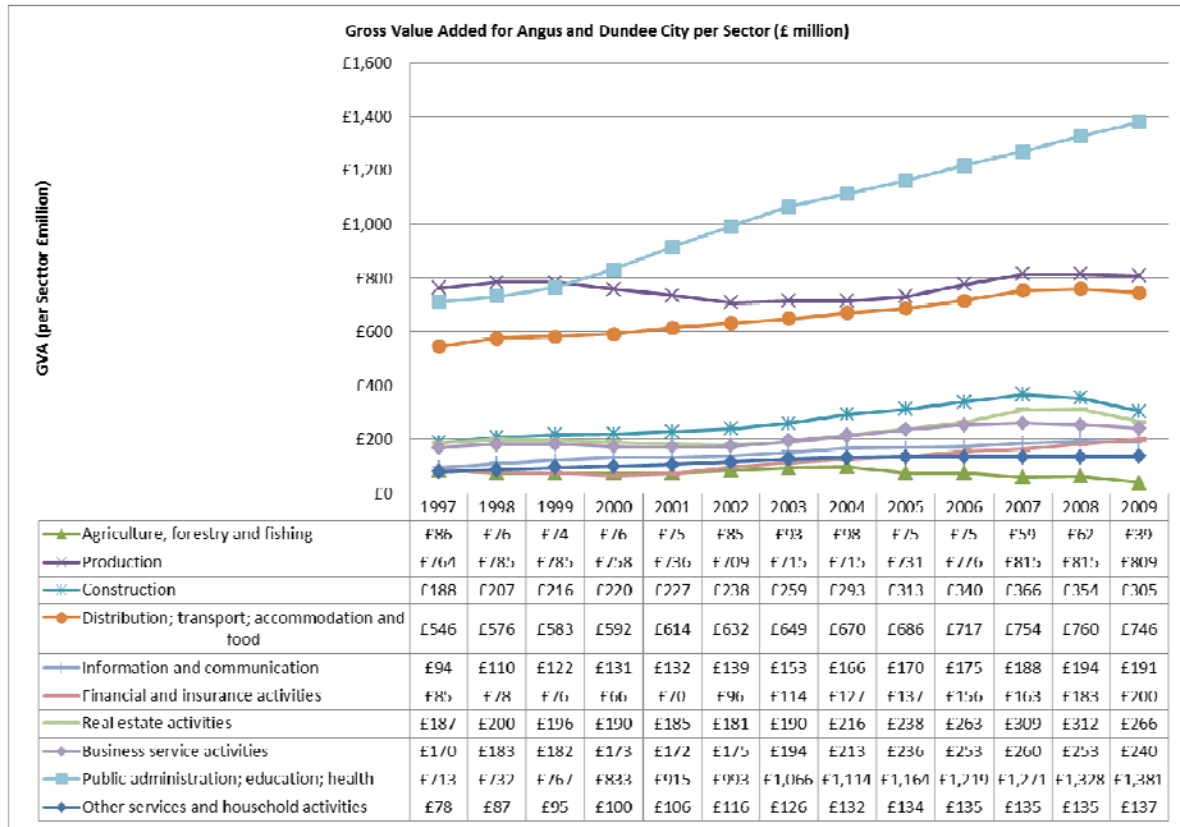

Plot 6: Gross Value Added (GVA) for East Lothian and Midlothian per Business Sector (1997 to 2009)



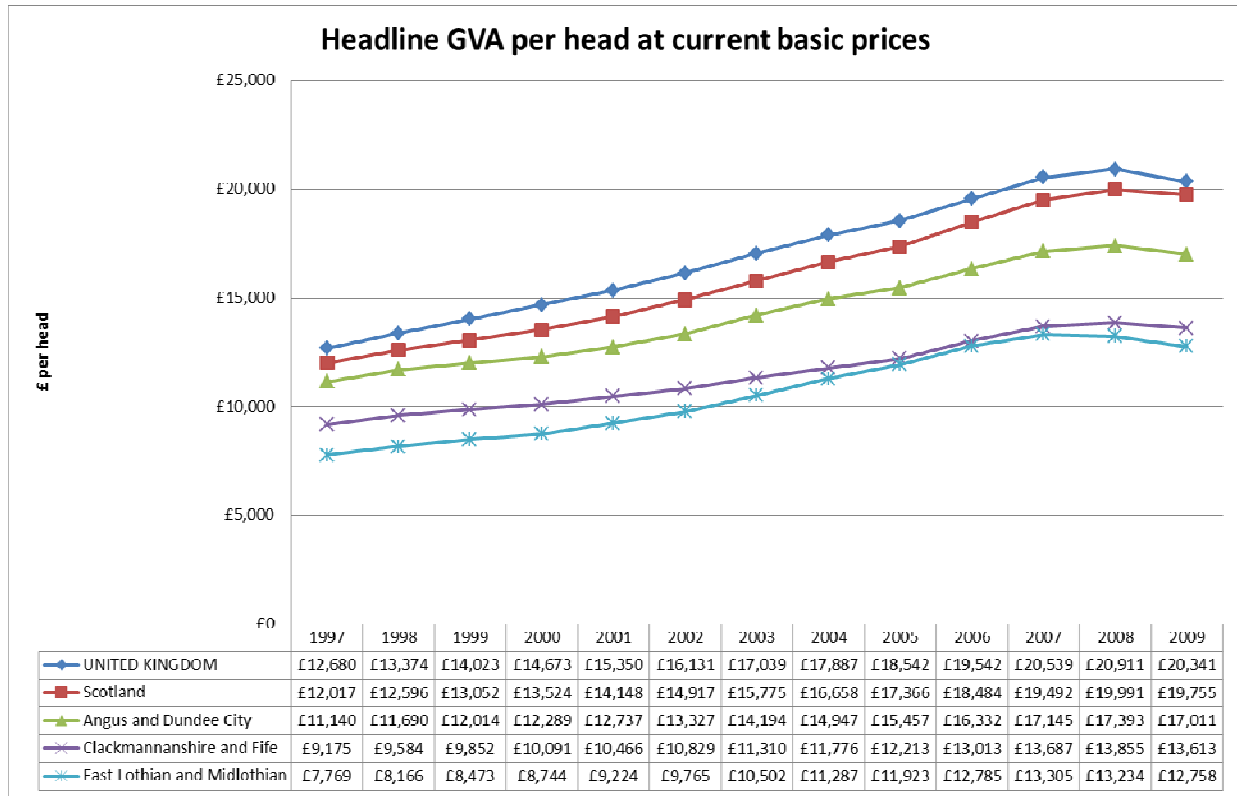
