#### 5. Project Details

The start date will not be backdated, since to commence a project for which a licence has not been obtained will constitute an offence, which may result in appropriate legal action. A licence is normally valid for the duration of the project but not exceeding 3 years. If a project will not be completed before a marine licence lapses, it will be necessary for licence holders to re-apply for a further licence to continue any ongoing work at least 14 weeks prior to the expiry date of the licence. Target duration for determination of a marine licence application is 14 weeks.
- (d) Provide the proposed completion date of the project.
- (e) Provide the cost of the works seawards of the tidal limit of MHWS. This estimate should only cover



work taking place below the tidal level of MHWS and must take into consideration the cost of materials, labour fees etc.

(f) Describe the location of the proposed works. Include a list of the latitude and longitude co-ordinates (WGS84) of the boundary points of the proposed project. WGS84 is the World Geodetic System 1984 and the reference co-ordinate system used for marine licence applications. Co-ordinates taken from GPS equipment should be set to WGS84. Coordinates taken from recent admiralty charts will be on a WGS84 compatible datum. Ordnance survey maps do not use WGS84. In a few cases, (e.g. laying of long pipelines) it may only be practicable to supply co-ordinates for the start and end points.

**Example:** For positions read from charts the format should be as in the example: 55°55.555'N 002°22.222'W (WGS84). The decimal point specifies that decimals of minutes are used and the datum is stated explicitly. If seconds are used then the format should be as in the example: 55°55'44"N 2°22'11"W (WGS84).

It is important that the correct positions, in the correct format, are included with this application, as any errors will result in the application being refused or delayed.

To supplement your application, please provide photographs of the project location and submit these with your application. Please also provide a suitably scaled extract of an Ordnance Survey Map (1:2,500 scale but not more than 1:10,000) or Admiralty Chart which must be marked to indicate:

- o the full extent of the works in relation to the surrounding area;
- o latitude and longitude co-ordinates defining the location of the works;
- the level of MHWS;
- o any adjacent SAC, SPA, SSSI, MPA, Ramsar or similar conservation area boundary.

Drawings and plans will be consulted upon. If they are subject to copyright, it is the responsibility of the applicant to obtain necessary approvals to reproduce the documents and to submit suitably annotated copies with the application.

**Sewer outfalls, discharge pipes for industrial waste etc.** The size and description of the pipe must be shown on the longitudinal sections and also details of its supports, foundations, methods of jointing and details of any tidal flaps.

**Bridges over tidal waters:** An elevation with longitudinal and cross-sections of the bridge to a suitable scale must show the dimensions of the spans and width of piers, etc. above and below MHWS and the maximum and minimum heights of the undersides of the superstructures above MHWS. The headroom above MHWS and the width of span of the nearest bridges, if any, above and below the site must be stated.

**Tunnels under tidal waters:** The longitudinal section of the tunnel must show the distances between the bed of the river or estuary and the top of the tunnels. Cross-sections must show the internal and external dimensions of the tunnel and particulars of construction. When a proposed future dredging level is known this must also be shown on all sections.

**Overhead cables:** Catenary must be supplied in addition to the site plan showing the minimum clearance of the cable at MHWS and the electrical clearance allowed.

- (g) Indicate if the project is located within the jurisdiction of a statutory harbour authority and provide details of the statutory harbour authority where relevant.
- (h) Provide a full method statement, including schedule of works and the ultimate fate of the structure.
- (i) Provide assessment of the potential impacts the works may have, including interference with other uses of the sea. #### 8. Noise Monitoring

Completion of a 'close-out' form, which allows licensees to provide details of the actual dates and locations where the activities occurred, is also required within 12 weeks of the completion of the 'noisy' activity or, in the case of prolonged activities such as piling for harbour construction or wind farms, at quarterly intervals or after each phase of foundation installation.

#### Cobbled Invert Reinstatement

Most of the existing cobble stones have been recovered. These will be prepared for reuse, removing any old mortar or growth. A small amount approx 5% will require to be imported to make up the shortfall, these will be mixed within the exisitng cobbles. This will be installed across the channel, under both arches tying in with the remaining cobbled invert. The stone will be placed into a 250mm thick mortar bed. The joints will be left open and allowed to fill with natural material. As agreed with the A&B planning authority the historic timber piles and cross-beams around the cut-water will also be re-installed. this is purely for aesthetic and historical reinstatement. These have also been recovered. Falling Invert Construction

The falling invert will be constructed both upstream and downstream of the pile lines. This will reach a maximum depth of between 2m to 2.5m. The falling invert will consist of imported large boulders, covered with a combination of existing and imported sands and gravels. These will extend the full width of the water-course channel.

(i) Potential impacts the works may have (including details of areas of concern e.g designated conservation and shellfish harvesting areas) and proposed mitigation in response to potential impacts (continue on separate sheet if necessary):

The scheme is not situated within nor has connectivity with a Statutory Designated Site e.g. Special Area of Conservation (SAC), Special Protection Area (SPA), Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI), Ramsar, National Nature Reserve (NNR), National Scenic Area (NSA), etc. The section of Loch Fyne within the scheme extent is also not a designated shellfish harvesting area.

The Upper Loch Fyne and Loch Goil Nature Conservation Marine Protected Area (NC MPA) lies approximately 24m downstream of the scheme extents. An Environmental Clark or Works (EnvCoW) will attend site prior to and/or during the works to update protected species checks and to ensure that all conditions of the Site Environmental Management Plan (SEMP) and relevant consents are being followed. Site staff are to comply with any recommendations given by the EnvCoW.

Pre-works checks for cetaceans (e.g., dolphins, whales) that may be present in Loch Fyne will be undertaken. If any cetaceans are identified in the vicinity of works, piling works must be delayed until the cetaceans have left the area. The works will be carried out during periods of low tide. If the works are required during periods of high tide, further consultation will be carried out with NatureScot prior to these works taking place.

For in-water works site staff will adhere to the Check-Clean-Dry biosecurity process to ensure that any machinery, boats, diving equipment, materials, wastes, or personal protective equipment that has been in contact with the marine environment is appropriately washed and dried prior to leaving site.

In-water works will take place below the level of mean high water springs (MHWS) levels and as such no works will take place prior to authorisation by the Marine Directorate. All conditions of the Marine Licence Exemption will be adhered to.

Where applicable and practicable, bio-degradable hydraulic fluids and oils will be utilised in machinery.

Pollution controls and good practice measures to reduce impacts of works on the local environment will be detailed in the SEMP and adhered to on site. Therefore, with the mitigation measures in place, the risk of significant impacts on biodiversity are considered to be low.
