CONSENT UNDER SECTION 36 THE ELECTRICITY ACT 1989 (AS AMENDED) AND A MARINE LICENCE UNDER PART 4 OF THE MARINE (SCOTLAND) ACT 2010 AND MARINE AND COASTAL ACCESS ACT 2009 TO CONSTRUCT AND OPERATE THE BEATRICE OFFSHORE WIND FARM, OUTER MORAY FIRTH

Thank you for your letter of 26<sup>th</sup> November 2015 (Ref. LF000005-LET-288) confirming that BOWL no longer intend to install metereological masts within the Offshore Wind Farm (OWF) area, and that the requirement for metereological masts has been superseded by the proposed installation of LiDAR equipment on certain turbines.

Marine Scotland Licensing Operations Team ("MS-LOT"), on behalf of the Scottish Ministers, are content with these proposed alterations to the Development and are satisfied that without the installation of the metereological masts, condition 3.2.1.6 of the OFW Marine Licence (licence number 04462/14/1), *Metereological mast(s) piling strategy*, is no longer required to be discharged.

Equally, MS-LOT are satisfied that without the installation of the metereological masts, the conditions listed below that apply to the Development as a whole, no longer require to to be discharged as far as they apply to metereological masts. These conditions are:

- Section 36 Consent, condition 38, no erection of infrastructure within 2.5km of Beatrice Alpha, Bravo, Charlie or Jackie Platforms
- OWF Marine Licence conditions
  - 3.2.1.3 Navigational and Aviation Safety and Charting
  - 3.2.2.4 Markings, lighting and signals of the Works
