MARINE (SCOTLAND) ACT 2010 PART 4 MARINE LICENSING

The Marine Works (Environmental Impact Assessment) (Scotland) Regulations 2017 (as amended)

Further to Marine Scotland Licensing Operations Team's ("MS-LOT") letter of 6th November 2017, confirming agreement with Aberdeen Offshore Wind Farm Limited's ("AOWFLs") proposal to appoint suitably briefed members of the ship's crew as Marine Mammal Observers ("MMO").
