3. Description of works:

Existing marine farm, Gob na Hoe, Loch Dunvegan, Skye

As described in application dated 31 October 2017, and correspondence submitted in support of the application.

- 4. Nature and quantity of all deposits below Mean High Water Springs:
 - a) The total number of permitted ring cages shall be: 8
 - b) The total number of permitted grid moorings shall be: 22
 - c) The total number of permitted marked buoys shall be: 15
 - d) The total number of permitted associated boat moorings shall be: 0
 - e) The total number of permitted pontoons shall be: 0
 - f) The total number of permitted feed barges shall be: 1

Part 2 - Conditions

1. The licensee must ensure that only the deposits listed in Part 1 of the licence are deposited during the execution of the works and that all substances or objects deposited during the execution of the works are inert and do not contain toxic elements which may be harmful to the marine environment, the living resources which it supports or human health.

- 2. The licensee must ensure that any debris or waste materials arising during the course of the works are removed from the site of the works for disposal at an approved location above the tidal level of Mean High Water Springs.
- 3. The licensee must, within 28 days of completion of the works or within 28 days of the date of expiry of the licence, whichever is the sooner, submit a written report to the licensing authority stating the nature and quantity of all substances and objects deposited below Mean High Water Springs under authority of the licence. Where appropriate, nil returns shall be provided.
- 4. The licensee must notify Source Data Receipt, The Hydrographic Office, Admiralty Way, Taunton, Somerset, TA1 2DN (e-mail: sdr@ukho.gov.uk; tel.: 01823 337900) of both progress and on completion of the works supply a copy of the licence, and wherever possible, 'as built plans', in order that all necessary amendments to nautical publications are made.
- 5. The licensee must ensure that a copy of this licence is given to each contractor appointed to carry out part or all of the works in order that they are clear about the extent of the works for which the licence has been given and the conditions that are attached to the licence.
- 6. The licensee must ensure that the local mariners' and fishermen's organisations are made fully aware of the activity through local notice to mariners or any other appropriate means.
- 7. The licensee must ensure that HM Coastguard, in this case nmoccontroller@hmcg.gov.uk, The National Maritime Operations Centre is made aware of the works prior to commencement.
- 8. The licensee must ensure appropriate steps are taken to minimise damage to the beach, foreshore and seabed by the works.
- 9. The licensee must ensure suitable bunding and storage facilities are employed to prevent the release of fuel oils, lubricating fluids associated with the plant and equipment into the marine environment.
- 10. The licensee must ensure that the works do not encroach on any recognised anchorage, either charted or noted in nautical publications, within the proposed consent area.
- 11. The licensee must ensure that:
 - a) The site is marked with 2 lit yellow poles fitted with yellow 'X' topmarks.
 - b) Each light must display a character of flash one yellow every five seconds (FI Y 5s) with a nominal range of 2 nautical miles, and be installed above the 'X' topmark.
 - c) The poles must be positioned at the Northerly and Easterly seaward corners of the cage group.

- d) Each light must be 1 metre above site equipment handrails and installed to be clearly seen by vessels approaching from all navigable directions.
- e) Poles must be ≥75mm diameter, the 'X' topmark must be ≥ 75cm length by 15cm wide.
- f) The feed barge must exhibit an all-round fixed white light with a nominal range of 2 nautical miles for a point at least 1 metre above any other obstruction.
- 12. The licensee must ensure that the navigation marking and lighting given in condition 11 are installed at the same time as the site equipment and continued unless and until the licensing authority rescind this direction.
- 13. The licensee must ensure that a weekly check of the sites marking and lighting equipment is made and records kept of its physical state for audit purposes.
- 14. If it is desired to display any marks or lights not required by this licence then details shall be submitted to the Northern Lighthouse Board and their ruling complied with. The display of unauthorised marks or lights is prohibited.
- 15. The licensee must ensure that the works are maintained at all times in good repair.
- 16. The licensee must ensure that no deviation from the schedule specified in the licence is made without the further written consent of the licensing authority.
- 17. If in the opinion of the licensing authority the assistance of a Government Department, including the broadcast of navigational warnings, is required to deal with any emergency arising from:
 - a) The failure to mark and light the works as required by licence.
 - b) The maintenance of the works.
 - c) The drifting or wreck of the works.

The licensee shall be liable for any expenses incurred in securing such assistance.

- 18. In the event of the licensed operations being discontinued the works must be removed and the site cleared to the satisfaction of the licensing authority.
- 19. The licensee must remove the works from below the level of Mean High Water Springs, or such alterations made, within one month of notice being given by the licensing authority at any time it is considered necessary or advisable for the safety of navigation, and not replaced without further consent by the licensing authority. The licensee shall be liable for any expense incurred.
- 20. Any person authorised by the licensing authority must be permitted to inspect the works at any reasonable time.
- 21. The licensee must ensure that copies of the licence are available for inspection by any authorised Enforcement Officer at:

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- a) the premises of the licensee;
- b) the premises of any agent acting on behalf of the licensee; and
- c) the site of the works.
- 22. In the event of the licensee becoming aware that any of the information on which the issue of the licence was based has changed, the licensing authority must be immediately notified of the details.
- 23. If a new licence is required, the licensee shall make an application at least twelve weeks before the expiry date of this licence. This licence shall not continue in force after the expiry date of 30 November 2022.

NOTES

- 1. You are deemed to have satisfied yourself that there are no barriers, legal or otherwise, to the carrying out of the licensed operations. The issue of the licence does not absolve the licensee from obtaining such authorisations, consents etc which may be required under any other legislation.
- 2. In the event that the licensee wishes any of the particulars set down in the Schedule to be altered, the licensing authority shall be immediately notified of the alterations. It should be noted that changes can invalidate a licence, and that an application for a new licence may be necessary.
- 3. Under Section 30 of the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010, the licensing authority may vary, suspend or revoke the licence, if it appears to the authority that there has been a breach of any of the provisions of the licence or for any other reason that appears to be relevant to the authority.
- 4. Under Section 39 of the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010, it is an offence to carry on a licensable marine activity or cause or permit any other person to carry on such an activity without a marine licence or fails to comply with any condition of a marine licence. It is a defence for a person charged with an offence under Section 40 in relation to any activity to prove that the activity was carried out for the purpose of saving life, or for the purposes of securing the safety of a vessel, aircraft or marine structure ('force majeure'), and that the person took steps within a reasonable time to provide full details of the incident to the licensing authority. (Under Annex II, Article 7 of the Convention for the Protection of the Marine Environment of the North-east Atlantic, the licensing authority is obliged to immediately report 'force majeure' incidents to the Convention Commission).
