Explanatory Notes

2. Agent Details

3. Payment

5. Marine Farm Details

The start date will not be backdated, since to commence a project for which a licence has not been obtained will constitute an offence, which may result in appropriate legal action. A licence is normally valid for 6 years. Target duration for determination of a marine licence application is 14 weeks.
- (e) Provide the cost of the works seawards of the tidal limit of MHWS. This estimate should only cover work taking place below the tidal level of MHWS and must take into consideration the cost of materials, labour fees etc.
- (f) Describe the location of the proposed works. Include a list of the latitude and longitude co-ordinates (WGS84) of the boundary points of the moorings area and for each of the component parts of the marine farm, including sub-surface equipment. WGS84 is the World Geodetic System 1984 and the reference co-ordinate system used for marine licence applications. Co-ordinates taken from GPS equipment should be set to WGS84. Coordinates taken from recent admiralty charts will be on a WGS84 compatible datum. Ordnance survey maps do not use WGS84.







Example: For positions read from charts the format should be as in the example: 55°55.555'N 002°22.222'W (WGS84). The decimal point specifies that decimals of minutes are used and the datum is stated explicitly. If seconds are used then the format should be as in the example: 55°55'44"N 2°22'11"W (WGS84).

It is important that the correct positions, in the correct format, are included with this application, as any errors will result in the application being refused or delayed.

To supplement your application, please provide a suitably scaled extract of an Ordnance Survey Map (1:2,500 scale but not more than 1:10,000) or Admiralty Chart which must be marked to indicate:

- o the full extent of the works in relation to the surrounding area;
- o latitude and longitude co-ordinates defining the location of the works;
- the level of MHWS;

Drawings and plans will be consulted upon. If they are subject to copyright, it is the responsibility of the applicant to obtain necessary approvals to reproduce the documents and to submit suitably annotated copies with the application.

- (g) Indicate if the marine farm is located within the jurisdiction of a statutory harbour authority and provide details of the statutory harbour authority where relevant.
- (h) Provide assessment of the potential impacts the works may have on navigation, including interference with other uses of the sea.

Where there are potential impacts from the works, please provide details of proposed mitigation in response to potential impacts.

6. Planning Permission

Indicate if you have, or if you are in the process of applying for, planning permission for the marine farm. Provide the reference number for the planning application if applicable and/or supply a copy of the planning permission along with the completed application form.

Marine licence applications will not be determined without valid planning permission.

7. Scotland's National Marine Plan

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(h) Potential impacts the works may have on navigation and proposed mitigation in response to potential impacts (continue on separate sheet if necessary): Following recommendations from the Northern Lighthouse Board (NLB), a number of lighting and marking measures will be applied to ensure the site is compliant with navigational requirements. A regular car and passenger ferry service operates between Laxo ferry terminal on the north shore of Dury Voe to Symbister on the island of Whalsay, east of Dury Voe. The proposed Swarta Skerry farm is located closer to the Whalsay ferry route than the existing Grunna Voe and Loura Voe farms and to ensure the proposed location does not impinge on safe navigation of the ferry, SSF undertook pre-application consultation with Shetland Ferries. This discussion resulted in a slight change in the orientation of the site so that it was parallel with the ferry transit route and agreement to install two additional navigation lights along the edge of the cage group closest to the ferry route. The proposed location of the Swarta Skerry farm and agreement by SSF to install navigational marking and lighting, as requested by the Northern Lighthouse Board and Shetland Ferries, will ensure that the farm will allow the continued safe operation and navigation of ferry traffic in Dury Voe and other commercial and recreational marine users in all weathers. Moorings are visually inspected annually by qualified diver and/or ROV survey to check for damage and SSF are committed to reducing our GHG emissions across our business and are signed up the Energy Savings Opportunity Scheme as a means of monitoring and reducing GHG emissions. All machinery on site is regularly maintained to ensure optimum operation. SSF are also compliant with ISO 14001. Where possible any equipment used on site is recycled at the end of its life. Navigational marker buoys will be deployed at this site as per NLB recommendations and will be regularly maintain to ensure good working order.
