Explanatory Notes

The start date will not be backdated, since to commence a project for which a licence has not been obtained will constitute an offence, which may result in appropriate legal action. A licence is normally valid for 6 years. **Target duration for determination of a marine licence application is 14 weeks.**
- (g) Describe the location of the proposed works. Include a list of the latitude and longitude co-ordinates (WGS84) for each mooring or for the boundary points of any moorings area. WGS84 is the World Geodetic System 1984 and the reference co-ordinate system used for marine licence applications. Coordinates taken from GPS equipment should be set to WGS84. Coordinates taken from recent admiralty charts will be on a WGS84 compatible datum. Ordnance survey maps do not use WGS84.







Example: For positions read from charts the format should be as in the example: 55°55.555'N 002°22.222'W (WGS84). The decimal point specifies that decimals of minutes are used and the datum is stated explicitly. If seconds are used then the format should be as in the example: 55°55'44"N 2°22'11"W (WGS84).

It is important that the correct positions, in the correct format, are included with this application, as any errors will result in the application being refused or delayed.

Drawings and plans will be consulted upon. If they are subject to copyright, it is the responsibility of the applicant to obtain necessary approvals to reproduce the documents and to submit suitably annotated copies with the application.

- (h) Indicate if the mooring is located within the jurisdiction of a statutory harbour authority and provide details of the statutory harbour authority where relevant.
- (i) Provide assessment of the potential impacts the works may have, including interference with other uses of the sea. Please include details of areas of concern e.g designated conservation areas, such as a SAC, SPA, SSSI, MPA or Ramsar site and shellfish harvesting areas. Lochs Creran, Alsh, Duich and Long are designated as Special Areas of Conservation (SAC) under the Habitats Directive (Council Directive 92/43/EEC). Loch Creran has been selected for its bedrock and biogenic reefs of the tube worm *Serpula vermicularis* and the horse mussel, *Modiolus modiolus* and Lochs Alsh, Duich and Long for their sublittoral rock (marine) reefs. All are very sensitive to physical damage from anchors and the placement of moorings and in order to assist their protection reference should be made to the special moorings pack which can be downloaded from the following link: http://www.scotland.gov.uk/Topics/marine/Licensing/marine/Applications

Installation of 4 anchors for the single mooring. Prototype buoy testing period of 6 months. Regular inspection and periodic connection is to be made with the buoy. Estimated time vessels will be present at buoy is less than 3 hours a week.

The area is highlighted as being key for Sandwich Tern as part of the Ythan Estuary protected area. Our project is on the edge of the area highlighted and will be small scale causing minimum disruption to the birds. The site is located East of the main shipping route from Aberdeen to Peterhead so will not disturb regular vessels.

The mooring JSL (Jebb Smith Ltd) is applying for will allow testing of a new mooring buoy. The buoy needs to prove it is easy to use and dosen't exhibit signs of unreasonable deterioration while at sea. It must remain easy to use in a variety of operational sea states. This buoy will ultimatly be used offshore to reduce the emissions of diesel CTV vessels and will be adaptable for electric CTV's providing an offshore charging solution. This will make hybrid and electric CTV vessels more viable for use in windfarm maintance, thus lowering the carbon footprint of offshore wind energy (GEN 1). JSL is an Aberdeen based company. With the success of this new buoy, production of the product will increase jobs in the Aberdeen area (GEN 2 & GEN 3).
