Explanatory Notes

A licence is normally valid for 6 years. Target duration for determination of a marine licence application is 14 weeks.
- (e) Provide the cost of the works seawards of the tidal limit of MHWS. This estimate should only cover work taking place below the tidal level of MHWS and must take into consideration the cost of materials, labour fees etc.
- (f) Describe the location of the proposed works. Include a list of the latitude and longitude co-ordinates (WGS84) of the boundary points of the moorings area and for each of the component parts of the marine farm, including sub-surface equipment. WGS84 is the World Geodetic System 1984 and the reference co-ordinate system used for marine licence applications. Co-ordinates taken from GPS equipment should be set to WGS84. Coordinates taken from recent admiralty charts will be on a WGS84 compatible datum. Ordnance survey maps do not use WGS84.







Example: For positions read from charts the format should be as in the example: 55°55.555'N 002°22.222'W (WGS84). The decimal point specifies that decimals of minutes are used and the datum is stated explicitly. If seconds are used then the format should be as in the example: 55°55'44"N 2°22'11"W (WGS84).

It is important that the correct positions, in the correct format, are included with this application, as any errors will result in the application being refused or delayed.

To supplement your application, please provide a suitably scaled extract of an Ordnance Survey Map (1:2,500 scale but not more than 1:10,000) or Admiralty Chart which must be marked to indicate:

- o the full extent of the works in relation to the surrounding area;
- o latitude and longitude co-ordinates defining the location of the works;
- the level of MHWS;

Drawings and plans will be consulted upon. If they are subject to copyright, it is the responsibility of the applicant to obtain necessary approvals to reproduce the documents and to submit suitably annotated copies with the application.

- (g) Indicate if the marine farm is located within the jurisdiction of a statutory harbour authority and provide details of the statutory harbour authority where relevant.
- (h) Provide assessment of the potential impacts the works may have on navigation, including interference with other uses of the sea.

Where there are potential impacts from the works, please provide details of proposed mitigation in response to potential impacts.

6. Planning Permission

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(h) Potential impacts the works may have on navigation and proposed mitigation in response to potential impacts (continue on separate sheet if necessary):

The Caolas site in this location is long established and the increase in the proposed Mooring Containment Area (MCA) is only 0.45% compared to the current MCA. There are no anchorages in the immediate vicinity of the site (the nearest formal anchorage is over 1km away; straight line distance) and the proposed amendment to the MCA is not anticipated to be significant relative to any activities of inshore fisheries that operate within the area. The Cal Mac ferry service between Uig, Skye and Lochmaddy runs approximately 2 km to the south of the site and the proposed amendments to the site are considered unlikely to cause navigational issues to this service. If consented, the site will be lit and marked as per NLB requirements. The proposed modification is not anticipated to displace any aspect of socio-economic activity and historically there have been no conflicts of interest between ongoing fishing and aquaculture activities in this area.

The farm is aligned with the NMP's general marine planning policies as follows:

Gen 2 and 3: The farm will provide socio-economic benefits to Scottish communities through provision of skilled employment and training opportunities and via contributing to maintaining population levels in a remote rural area.

The farm is aligned with the NMP's aquaculture-specific marine planning policies as follows:

Policies 1,2,3,5,6,7,8: The current site has been in operation since the 1990s. The proposed redevelopment was designed to minimise impacts relating to carrying capacity/locational guidelines, visual amenity, disease management areas, wild fish impacts and seal haulout sites. All required modelling and assessment has been undertaken and the site is considered to be within required limits. Policy 9: Emergency response plans are in place

Policy 10: Pre-application consultation will be conducted as part of the planning application determination process

Policy 11: The site equipment will be compliant with Marine Scotland Technical Standards for aquaculture. The hybrid-electric feedbarge will reduce generator run-time and associated emissions.

Policy 12: Cleaner fish (wrasse) will be used at the site for biological control of sealice, as part of a strategy of wider sealice controls, which also includes the use of freshwater treatments as alternatives to medicinal/chemical treatments.

Policy 14: Community benefits from the site will include direct, indirect and induced socio-economic benefits to local communities through provision of employment and wages to staff employed by farm operations in the Sutherland area and other local and regional companies/suppliers providing supply chain services (e.g. fuel, haulage, equipment, accommodation etc).
