Explanatory Notes

A licence is normally valid for 6 years. Target duration for determination of a marine licence application is 14 weeks.
- (e) Provide the cost of the works seawards of the tidal limit of MHWS. This estimate should only cover work taking place below the tidal level of MHWS and must take into consideration the cost of materials, labour fees etc.
- (f) Describe the location of the proposed works. Include a list of the latitude and longitude co-ordinates (WGS84) of the boundary points of the moorings area and for each of the component parts of the marine farm, including sub-surface equipment. WGS84 is the World Geodetic System 1984 and the reference co-ordinate system used for marine licence applications. Co-ordinates taken from GPS equipment should be set to WGS84. Coordinates taken from recent admiralty charts will be on a WGS84 compatible datum. Ordnance survey maps do not use WGS84.







Example: For positions read from charts the format should be as in the example: 55°55.555'N 002°22.222'W (WGS84). The decimal point specifies that decimals of minutes are used and the datum is stated explicitly. If seconds are used then the format should be as in the example: 55°55'44"N 2°22'11"W (WGS84).

It is important that the correct positions, in the correct format, are included with this application, as any errors will result in the application being refused or delayed.

To supplement your application, please provide a suitably scaled extract of an Ordnance Survey Map (1:2,500 scale but not more than 1:10,000) or Admiralty Chart which must be marked to indicate:

- o the full extent of the works in relation to the surrounding area;
- o latitude and longitude co-ordinates defining the location of the works;

Drawings and plans will be consulted upon. If they are subject to copyright, it is the responsibility of the applicant to obtain necessary approvals to reproduce the documents and to submit suitably annotated copies with the application.

- (g) Indicate if the marine farm is located within the jurisdiction of a statutory harbour authority and provide details of the statutory harbour authority where relevant.
- (h) Provide assessment of the potential impacts the works may have on navigation, including interference with other uses of the sea.

Where there are potential impacts from the works, please provide details of proposed mitigation in response to potential impacts.

6. Planning Permission

Application for change in use of the existing consented finfish farm to a shellfish (mussel) farm at Basta Voe North.

The current Basta Voe North mooring containment area does not encroach on any recognised anchorages, navigation channels or navigational light sectors. The footprint of the shellfish production infrastructure, including moorings, will be located entirely within the current consented mooring containment area (see attached chart 'BVN_Mussel_Site_1,5000_WGS84' and 'Basta Voe North Site Plan 2022').

No objection to the proposed change in use at the existing site was raised by the Northern Lighthouse Board (NLB) in their response to the associated application for planning permission (Reference 2022/001/MAR). As such, further to complying with the navigational marking advice provided by the NLB in their statutory consultee response, and use of equipment suitable for the conditions that meets any technical standards required, we consider that the residual risk to navigation and anchorage is considered negligible and unlikely to result in any significant effects.

A planning application for the change of use of an existing consented salmon farm to a mussel farm at Basta Voe, Shetland has been submitted to the Shetland Islands Council and was validated on 18 January 2022 (Reference 2022/001/MAR).

Mussel farming contributes to the following objectives from the National Marine Plan:

Objective 1: a sustainable, diverse, economically viable industry which contributes to food security whilst minimising environmental impact (mussels also provide important ecosystem services such as water filtration)

Objective 2: Scotland's shellfish (and specifically mussel) production targets

Objective 3: Provision of quality employment and sustainable economic activity in remote and rural areas (in this instance Yell, Shetland)

The application, which is for a change of use of an existing site (from salmon to mussel production) is also in line with the following aquaculture specific policies from the National Marine Plan (noting not all policies are directly relevant to shellfish production and/or a change in use of an existing site):

Policies 1, 2, 5: The location (within Basta Voe) is not considered to be unsuitable or sensitive (including with respect to landscape and visual impacts) to aquaculture development as evidenced by the existence of consented salmon and mussel farms. There are no landscape designations or seal haul outs within the wider area (Basta Voe and Hascosay Sound). This application is for a change of use of the current Basta Voe North site and hence would not be increasing the number of aquaculture developments within the Voe. Policy 10: Pre-application consultation has been undertaken with Crown Estate Scotland and Shetland Islands Council. SEPA, NatureScot and Marine Scotland are currently being consulted by the Local Planning Authority as statutory advisors to the planning consent process. Policy 11: Technical standards for equipment will be adhered to.
