**DECISION NOTICE RELATIVE TO APPLICATION FOR MULTI-STAGE REGULATORY  
APPROVAL**

**CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATION OF THE OFFSHORE TRANSMISSION  
INFRASTRUCTURE RELATIVE TO THE SEAGREEN ALPHA OFFSHORE WIND  
FARM AND THE SEAGREEN BRAVO OFFSHORE WIND FARM LOCATED IN THE  
FIRTH OF FORTH**

**1. Description of the Application**

- 1.1 On 10 October 2014 the Scottish Ministers granted, in favour of Seagreen Alpha Wind Energy Limited (Company Number 07185533) and Seagreen Bravo Wind Energy Limited (Company Number 07185543), both having its registered office previously at 55 Vastern Road, Reading, Berkshire and both now at No. 1 Forbury Place, 43 Forbury Road, Reading (“the Companies”), jointly a marine licence under part 4 of the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010 and Marine and Coastal Access

Act 2009 relative to the above works. The said marine licence was subsequently varied by the Scottish Ministers on 6 March 2019 (“the marine licence”). Condition 3.2.2.4 of the marine licence requires the Companies to submit a Construction Method Statement (“CMS”) for approval by the Scottish Ministers prior to commencing the above works.

- 1.2 On 19 February 2020 the Companies submitted to the Scottish Ministers the CMS for approval and applied for multi-stage regulatory approval in relation thereto in accordance with condition 3.2.2.4 of the marine licence.

## **2. Reasons and Considerations on which this decision is based**

- 2.1 Following consultation with Scottish Natural Heritage, the Northern Lighthouse Board, the Maritime Coastguard Agency, Scottish Environmental Protection Agency and Angus Council, an amended CMS was submitted to the Scottish Ministers by the Companies on 21 May 2020.
- 2.2 The information contained in the CMS is within the parameters of what has already been assessed within the Environmental Statement, the Addendum and the Erratum submitted in respect of the marine licence.
- 2.3 The Companies were not required to submit additional information under regulation 27 of the Marine Works (Environmental Impact Assessment) (Scotland) Regulations 2017 (as amended) in relation to the application for multi-stage regulatory approval.

## **3. Determination and Terms of Decision**

- 3.1 The Scottish Ministers, hereby approve the CMS as submitted on 21 May 2020 and grant multi-stage regulatory approval in relation thereto.
- 3.2 In the event that the Companies wish to update or amend the CMS, the Companies must submit, in writing, details of the proposed updates or amendments to the Scottish Ministers for their written approval prior to the planned implementation of the proposed updates or amendments. It is not permissible for any works associated with the proposed updates or amendments to proceed prior to the granting of such approval.

Unless otherwise agreed, in writing by the Scottish Ministers, all works must proceed in accordance with the CMS.
