Offshore Transmission Infrastructure – Application for a Marine Licence

This covering letter accompanies the application for a Marine Licence for the proposed Modified Offshore Transmission Infrastructure (OfTI) for the recently consented Telford, Stevenson and MacColl wind farms. This letter provides an overview of the application documents that are being submitted by Moray Offshore Renewables Limited (MORL) to Marine Scotland. 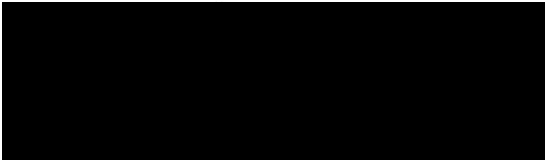
2. The MORL Modified Transmission Infrastructure Environmental Report.
