1. Applicant details

3. Payment

An invoice for the application fee will be issued by MD-LOT after an application is received and initial checks have been carried out. A marine licence for a finfish or shellfish farm can be valid for up to 25 years. If there is a requirement for a finfish or shellfish farm to continue after the expiry of a marine licence a new marine licence application will be required. Target duration for determination of a marine licence application where EIA is not required is 14 weeks.

- g) Describe the location of the proposed activity.

Include a list of the latitude and longitude co-ordinates (WGS84) of the boundary points of the proposed activity.

Latitude and longitude coordinates of the activity must be provided in World Geodetic System 1984 (WGS84) degrees, decimal minutes (to three decimal places) format XX°X.XXX'N XXX°X.XXX'W or E e.g. 57°8.5667'N 002°5.3833'W.

Coordinates taken from recent admiralty charts or GPS equipment are likely to be available in WGS84 compatible datum and in degrees, decimal minutes format.

It is important that the correct positions, in the correct format, are included with this application, as any errors will result in the application being refused or delayed.

To supplement your application, provide a suitably scaled extract of an Ordnance Survey Map (1:2,500 scale but not more than 1:10,000) or Admiralty Chart which must be marked to indicate:

- the full extent of the activity in relation to the surrounding area
- latitude and longitude co-ordinates defining the location of the activity

The map or chart may also show the level of MHWS and any adjacent SAC, SPA, SSSI, MPA, Ramsar or similar conservation area boundary.
