



## MARINE (SCOTLAND) ACT 2010, PART 4 MARINE LICENSING

## **1. PART 1 - GENERAL**

### **1.1 Interpretation**

In the licence, terms are as defined in Section 1, 64 and 157 of the Marine Scotland Act 2010, and

- a) **"the 2010 Act"** means the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010;
- b) **"Licensed Activity"** means any activity or activities listed in section 21 of the 2010 Act which is, or are authorised under the licence;
- c) **"Licensee"** means Scottish Hydro Electric Power Distribution Plc
- d) **"Mean High Water Springs"** means any area submerged at mean high water spring tide;
- e) **"Commencement of the Licensed Activity"** means the date on which the first vehicle or vessel arrives on the site to begin carrying on any activities in connection with the Licensed Activity;
- f) **"Completion of the Licensed Activity"** means the date on which the Licensed Activity has been installed in full, or the Licensed Activity has been deemed complete by the Licensing Authority, whichever occurs first;

All geographical co-ordinates contained within the licence are in WGS84 format (latitude and longitude degrees and minutes to three decimal places) unless otherwise stated.

### **1.3 Other authorisations and consents**

The Licensee is deemed to have satisfied itself that there are no barriers or restrictions, legal or otherwise, to the carrying on of the Licensed Activities in connection with the licensed activity. The issuing of the licence does not absolve the Licensee from obtaining such other authorisations and consents, which may be required under statute.

### **1.4 Variation, suspension, revocation and transfer**

Under section 30 (1) of the 2010 Act the Licensing Authority may by notice vary, suspend or revoke the licence granted by them if it appears to the Licensing Authority that there has been a breach of any of its provisions. For any such other reason that appears to be relevant to the Licensing Authority under section 30(2) or (3) of the 2010 Act.

Under the 2010 Act variations, suspensions, revocations and transfers of licences are subject to the procedures set out in section 31 of the Act.

Under section 30 (7) of the 2010 Act, on an application made by a licensee, the Licensing Authority may vary a licence if satisfied that the variation being applied for is not material.

Under section 30 (8) of the 2010 Act, on an application made by the licensee, the Licensing Authority may transfer the licence from the Licensee to another person.

### **1.5 Breach of requirement for, or conditions of, licence**

Under section 39 of the 2010 Act it is an offence to carry on a Licensable Marine Activity without a marine licence and it is also an offence to fail to comply with any condition of a marine licence.

### **1.6 Defences: actions taken in an emergency**

Under section 40 of the 2010 Act it is a defence for a person charged with an offence under section 39(1) of the 2010 Act in relation to any activity to prove that –  
the activity was carried out for the purpose of saving life, or for the purpose of securing the safety of a vessel, aircraft or marine structure ('force majeure'), and  
that the person took steps within a reasonable time to inform the Licensing Authority as set out in section 40(2) of the 2010 Act.

### **1.7 Offences relating to information**

Under section 42 of the 2010 Act it is an offence for a person to make a statement which is false or misleading in a material way, knowing the statement to be false or misleading or being reckless as to whether the statement is false or misleading, or to intentionally fail to disclose any material information for the purpose of procuring the issue, variation or transfer of a marine licence or for the purpose of complying with, or purporting to comply with, any obligation imposed by either Part 4 of the 2010 Act or the provisions of this licence.

### **1.8 Appeals**

Under Regulation 3(1) of the Marine Licensing Appeals (Scotland) Regulations 2011 a person who has applied for a marine licence may by summary application appeal to against a decision taken by the Licensing Authority under section 71(1)(b) or (c) or (5) of the Act.

### 2.3 Description of the Licensed Activity

Installation of a replacement 33kv submarine electricity cable between the islands of Skye and South Uist

As described in the application dated 02 September, 2025 and correspondence submitted in support of the application.

### 2.4 Descriptions of the materials to be used during the Licensed Activity

The licence authorises the use of the undernoted construction materials required in connection with the licensed activity, subject to the indicative amounts as specified below:

Materials deposited in the course of the Licensed Activity:

HVAC 33kV cable, 153.5 mm in diameter, approximately 40 Kilometres in length

Cast iron split pipe 750 metres

Rock berm 3600 metres

Rock bags x 170 each weighing 4 tonnes

Grout bags x 20 each weighing 1 tonne

Anchor Rods x 20 each weighing 2 kilogramme

Earthing clump weight x 4 each weighing 60 kilograms

Cable sea earthing deposits conductors x 8 total weight 4920 kilograms

Cable sea earthing deposits rods x 24 total weight 216 kilograms

Materials temporarily deposited in the course of the Licensed Activity:

Anchors x 4 maximum weight 15 Tonnes

Mooring Chains x 4

Intertidal pull in aids x 2

Clump weights x 4 maximum weight 15 Tonnes

### **3. PART 3 – CONDITIONS**

#### **3.1 General Conditions**

3.1.1 The Licensee must only construct the works in accordance with this licence, the application and any plans or programmes approved by the Licensing Authority unless otherwise authorised by the Licensing Authority.

3.1.2 The Licensee must maintain the works in accordance with the licence, the application and any plans or programmes approved by the Licensing Authority unless otherwise authorised by the Licensing Authority.

3.1.3 All conditions attached to the licence bind any person who for the time being owns, occupies or enjoys any use of the works, whether or not the licence has been transferred to that person.

3.1.4 Only the materials listed in Part 2 of the licence may be used during the execution of the Licensed Activity.

3.1.5 All materials used during the execution of the Licensed Activity must be inert and must not contain toxic elements which may be harmful to the marine environment, the living resources which it supports or human health.

3.1.6 The Licensee must ensure that the Licensed Activity does not encroach on any recognised anchorage, either charted or noted in nautical publications, within the licensed area as described in Part 2 of the licence.

3.1.7 The Licensee must provide written notification of any serious unforeseen incident of harm to the environment or human health, or any serious unforeseen incident of interference with legitimate uses of the sea during the Licensed Activity, to the Licensing Authority within 24 hours of the incident occurring.

3.1.8 The Licensee must notify Source Data Receipt, The Hydrographic Office, Admiralty Way, Taunton, Somerset, TA1 2DN (e-mail: sdr@ukho.gov.uk) of commencement of the licensed activities, at least 10 days before commencement of the works. The information supplied must include the start date and end date, a description of the works, positions of the work area (WGS84), and details of any marking arrangements. Notification must also be made within 5 working days of completion of the Licensed Activity. Such notification must include a copy of the licence, and wherever possible, 'as built plans', in order that all necessary amendments to nautical publications are made.

3.1.9 Details of any marks or lights not required by the licence must be submitted to the Northern Lighthouse Board and its ruling complied with. The display of unauthorised marks or lights is prohibited.

3.1.10 Where any damage, destruction, decay or catastrophic failure that could result in a danger or obstruction to navigation is caused to the Works or deposited Objects, the Licensee must notify the Licensing Authority, the UK Hydrographic Office, Maritime and Coastguard Agency, Northern Lighthouse Board, Kingfisher Information Services of Seafish and regional fisheries contacts of such damage, destruction, decay or catastrophic failure in writing as soon as reasonably practicable but no later than six hours after becoming aware of any such damage, destruction, decay or catastrophic failure.

The Licensee must submit a plan to remedy the damage, destruction, decay or catastrophic failure, to the Licensing Authority, for its written approval, within a time period stipulated by the Licensing Authority. The Licensee must carry out the remedial action identified in the plan

approved by the Licensing Authority within the period stipulated by the Licensing Authority. The Licensee shall be responsible for the cost of carrying out the activity identified in the plan.

3.1.11 If governmental assistance is required (including UK governmental assistance or the assistance of any UK devolved government) to deal with any emergency arising from:

- a) the failure to mark and light the Works as required by the licence;
- b) the maintenance of the Works; or
- c) the drifting or wreck of the Works,

to include the broadcast of navigational warnings, then the Licensee is liable for any expenses incurred in securing such assistance.

3.1.12 The Licensee must ensure that any cable protection works do not compromise safe navigation through depth reduction. There must be no more than a 5% reduction in surrounding depth referenced to Chart Datum

3.1.13 The Licensee must adopt measures to prevent the introduction and spread of invasive non-native species as a result of the Licensed Activity.

3.1.14 In the event of the Licensed Activity being ceased or terminated before completion, the materials used under the authority of the licence must be removed from the seabed to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority.

3.1.15 The Licensee must ensure that the works are maintained at all times in good repair.

3.1.16 The Licensee must ensure that the Licensed Activity is only carried out at the location of the Licensed Activity specified in Part 2 of the licence.

3.1.17 The Licensee must ensure that all licensed activities are carried out in strict accordance with the Marine Environmental Appraisal, P2816\_ R6688\_Rev2, as submitted to the Licensing Authority.

3.1.18 The Licensee must ensure that the Licensed Activity does not encroach on any recognised anchorage, either charted or noted in nautical publications, within the licensed area as described in Part 2 of the Licence.

### **3.2 Prior to the commencement of the Licensed Activity**

3.2.1 The Licensee must notify the Licensing Authority in writing of the name and address of any agent, contractor or sub-contractor not already listed in Part 2 of the licence being used to carry out any Licensed Activity listed in Part 2 of the licence. Such notification must be received by the Licensing Authority no less than 24 hours before the commencement of the Licensed Activity

3.2.2 The Licensee must issue local notification to marine users, including [navigation@nlb.org.uk](http://navigation@nlb.org.uk), fisher's organisations, neighbouring port authorities and other local stakeholders, of the commencement days before the Commencement of the Licensed Activity.

3.2.3 The Licensee must notify HM Coastguard ([Zone36@hmcg.gov.uk](mailto:Zone36@hmcg.gov.uk)) no less than 7 days prior to the Commencement of the Licensed Activity.

3.2.4 The Licensee must submit a Cable Burial and Protection Plan (CBPP) to the Licensing Authority for its written approval no later than two months prior to the Commencement of the Licensed Activity. It is not permissible for the Licensed Activity to commence prior to the granting of such approval. In granting such approval, the Licensing Authority may consult any such other advisers, organisations or stakeholders as may be required at its discretion. The CBPP must be consistent with the marine licence application and supporting information. All works must proceed in accordance with the approved CBPP. The CBPP must include the following:

- a) Details of the location of all works relating to the licence and cable laying techniques;
- b) Summaries of the survey work used to inform cable routing. The summaries must include geophysical, geotechnical and benthic surveys, desk top studies and cable route studies where available. A non-technical summary of this information must be provided;
- c) A burial plan based on survey data to show proposed burial depths throughout the whole cable route. In locations where burial is not proposed, it must be demonstrated, to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority, that burial is not feasible. In locations where burial is not feasible, cables must be suitably protected through recognised and approved measures where practicable, and as risk assessments direct;
- d) Proposals for survey activity and programming to ensure safety of navigation to other legitimate users of the sea, and with particular relevance to fishing activity, in line with industry best practices and guidelines. Such proposals must apply to the entire cable route;
- e) Proposals for further surveys to be undertaken, determined by the analysis of the data from previous survey activity and subsequent modelling and trending of seabed conditions; and
- f) Steps taken to ensure existing and future safe navigation is not compromised.
- g) Details describing the location, size and information contained on cable marker boards to be installed at each end of the cable route

3.2.5 The Licensee must, no later than two months prior to the Commencement of the Works, submit a Protocol for Archaeological Discoveries and a WSI which sets out what the Licensee must do on discovering any marine archaeology during the construction, operation, maintenance and monitoring of the Works, in writing, to the Licensing Authority for its written approval. Such approval may be given only following consultation by the Licensing Authority with Historic Environment Scotland and any such advisors as may be required at the discretion of the Licensing Authority. Commencement of the Works cannot take place until such approval is granted. The Reporting Protocol must be implemented in full, at all times, by the Licensee. The final PAD and WSI must be sent to the local authority for information only.

3.2.6 The Licensee must submit an updated Construction Environmental Management Plan which must include an updated Marine Mammal Protection Plan ("MMPP") to the Licensing Authority for its written approval no later than two months prior to the Commencement of the Licensed Activity. It is not permissible for the Licensed Activity to commence prior to the granting of such approval. In granting such approval, the Licensing Authority may consult any such other advisers, organisations or stakeholders as may be required at its discretion. The MMPP must include the following:

- a) A vessel plan requiring slow movement of vessels and adherence to the Scottish Marine Wildlife Watching Code ("SMWWC") at all times.

- b) The presence of a qualified MMO on board, and adherence to the geophysical survey mitigation guidance (JNCC, 2017) to ensure pre-shoot watches are conducted before USBL is used.
- c) If the USBL is to be utilised in the hours of darkness a PAM operator is required.
- d) The inclusion of a 500m mitigation zone for the use of USBL, if a marine mammal is detected within the mitigation zone during the pre-shooting search (visually or acoustically), the USBL must be delayed until their passage, or the transit of the vessel, results in the cetaceans being outside the mitigation zone.
- e) A 20-minute delay is to be observed from the time of the last detection within the mitigation zone and the commencement of the USBL to allow animals not visible (i.e., not re-surfacing in that time) to have moved outside of the mitigation zone.

### **3.3 During the Licensed Activity**

3.3.1 Only those persons acting on behalf of, and authorised by, the agent or the Licensee shall undertake the Licensed Activity.

3.3.2 The Licensee must ensure that any debris or waste materials arising during the course of the Licensed Activity are removed for disposal at an approved location above the tidal level of Mean High Water Springs.

3.3.3 The Licensee must ensure that a copy of the licence is available for inspection by a Marine Enforcement Officer at:

- a) the premises of the Licensee;
- b) the premises of any agent, contractor and sub-contractor engaged in the Licensed Activity;
- c) location of the Licensed Activity;
- d) any vessel or vehicle carrying on the Licensed Activity.

3.3.4 The Licensee must provide a copy of the licence to each agent, contractor and sub-contractor engaged in the Licensed Activity and must ensure that any person engaged in the Licensed Activity is aware of the particulars in Part 2 of the licence and the conditions in Part 3 of the licence.

3.3.5 The Licensee must minimise suspension of sediment and minimise damage to the seabed when carrying on the Licensed Activity.

3.3.6 The Licensee must ensure appropriate steps are taken to minimise damage to the foreshore and seabed during the Licensed Activity.

3.3.7 Any person authorised by the Licensing Authority must be permitted to inspect the site at any reasonable time.

3.3.8 If the Licensee becomes aware that an accidental deposit has occurred, the Licensee must notify the Licensing Authority as soon as practicable. The Licensee must undertake such survey as directed by the Licensing Authority to locate the substances, objects and materials. If the Licensing Authority is of the view that any accidental deposits have occurred and should be removed, then the materials must be removed by the Licensee as soon as is practicable and at the Licensee's expense.

### 3.4 Upon Completion of the Licensed Activity

3.4.1 The Licensee must submit a decommissioning plan to the licensing authority for approval two years prior to the predicted end of life of the cable or immediately in the case of cable faulting. The plan must be based on best practice at that time. The Licensee shall be liable for all costs.

3.4.2 The Licensee must carry out an assessment of any risks to the safety of navigation and other legitimate uses of the sea posed by the presence of the Works within eight weeks of the completion of cable laying and protection works or such other time as directed by the Licensing Authority in writing. The Licensee must submit a report detailing any risks identified, and the mitigation proposed to address the risks, to the Licensing Authority within 12 weeks of the the completion of cable laying and protection works or such other time as directed by the Licensing Authority in writing.

3.4.3 The Licensee must notify the Kingfisher Information Service - Offshore Renewables & Cable Awareness of the 'as laid' cable location and a 500 m zone either side of it as a hazardous area for anchoring following completion of the Works.

3.4.4 The Licensee must submit a written report regarding the materials used during the works to the Licensing Authority. The written report must be submitted on completion of the works and on the forms provided by the Licensing Authority no later than 31 October 2028.

3.4.5 The seabed must be returned as close as reasonably practicable to the original profile following completion of the Licensed Activity unless otherwise agreed in writing with Licensing Authority.

3.4.6 The licensee must submit 'as-laid' plans of the cable and positions of the new cable marker boards to the UK Hydrographic Office ([sdr@ukho.gov.uk](mailto:sdr@ukho.gov.uk)) to enable the update of navigational publications.
