



MARINE SCOTLAND ACT 2010, PART 4 MARINE LICENSING

1. PART 1 - GENERAL

1.1 Interpretation

In the licence, terms are as defined in Section 1, 64 and 157 of the Marine Scotland Act 2010, and

- a) "the 2010 Act" means the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010;
- b) "Licensed Activity" means any activity or activities listed in section 21 of the 2010 Act which is, or are authorised under the licence:
- c) "Licensee" means Network Rail
- d) "Mean high water springs" means any area submerged at mean high water spring tide;
- e) "Commencement of the Licensed Activity" means the date on which the first vehicle or vessel arrives on the site to begin carrying on any activities in connection with the Licensed Activity;
- f) "Completion of the Licensed Activity" means the date on which the Licensed Activity has been installed in full, or the Licensed Activity has been deemed complete by the Licensing Authority, whichever occurs first;

All geographical co-ordinates contained within the licence are in WGS84 format (latitude and longitude degrees and minutes to three decimal places) unless otherwise stated.

1.3 Other authorisations and consents

The Licensee is deemed to have satisfied itself that there are no barriers or restrictions, legal or otherwise, to the carrying on of the Licensed Activities in connection with the licensed activity. The issuing of the licence does not absolve the Licensee from obtaining such other authorisations and consents, which may be required under statute.

1.4 Variation, suspension, revocation and transfer

Under section 30 (1) of the 2010 Act the Licensing Authority may by notice vary, suspend or revoke the licence granted by them if it appears to the Licensing Authority that there has been a breach of any of its provisions. For any such other reason that appears to be relevant to the Licensing Authority under section 30(2) or (3) of the 2010 Act. Under the 2010 Act variations, suspensions, revocations and transfers of licences are subject to the procedures set out in section 31 of the Act.

Under section 30 (7) of the 2010 Act, on an application made by a licensee, the Licensing Authority may vary a licence if satisfied that the variation being applied for is not material.

Under section 30 (8) of the 2010 Act, on an application made by the licensee, the Licensing Authority may transfer the licensee to another person.

1.5 Breach of requirement for, or conditions of, licence

Under section 39 of the 2010 Act it is an offence to carry on a Licensable Marine Activity without a marine licence and it is also an offence to fail to comply with any condition of a marine licence.

1.6 Defences: actions taken in an emergency

Under section 40 of the 2010 Act it is a defence for a person charged with an offence under section 39(1) of the 2010 Act in relation to any activity to prove that –

the activity was carried out for the purpose of saving life, or for the purpose of securing the safety of a vessel, aircraft or marine structure ('force majeure'), and

that the person took steps within a reasonable time to inform the Licensing Authority as set out in section 40(2) of the 2010 Act.

1.7 Offences relating to information

Under section 42 of the 2010 Act it is an offence for a person to make a statement which is false or misleading in a material way, knowing the statement to be false or misleading or being reckless as to whether the statement is false or misleading, or to intentionally fail to disclose any material information for the purpose of procuring the issue, variation or transfer of a marine licence or for the purpose of complying with, or purporting to comply with, any obligation imposed by either Part 4 of the 2010 Act or the provisions of this licence.

1.8 Appeals

Under Regulation 3(1) of the Marine Licensing Appeals (Scotland) Regulations 2011 a person who has applied for a marine licence may by summary application appeal to against a decision taken by the Licensing Authority under section 71(1)(b) or (c) or (5) of the Act.

2.3 Description of the Licensed Activity

Bridge Maintenance Works - Clyde Bridge, River Clyde

As described in application dated 23 November, 2018 and correspondence submitted in support of the application.

2.4 Descriptions of the materials to be used during Licensed Activity

This licence authorises the use of the undernoted construction materials required in connection with the licensed activity, subject to the amounts as specified below:

Materials to be used in construction:

30 tonnes of S275 steel/iron 10 tonnes of C16 softwood 75,000 litres of paint 2850 tonnes of shot blasting materials

Materials to be used in temporary construction:

2250 tonnes of S275 steel/iron250 tonnes of C16 softwood25 tonnes of plastic/synthetic scaffold encapsulation

Materials to be removed during construction:

10 tonnes of C16 softwood 3150 tonnes of shot blasting materials

Less any materials already used under marine licence number 06822/19/0.

3. PART 3 - CONDITIONS

3.1 General Conditions

3.1.1. The Licensee must notify the Licensing Authority of the date of commencement and the date of completion of all operations relating to the licence. Separate notifications are required at the times of commencement and completion.

- 3.1.2 The Licensee must ensure that only the materials listed in Part 2 of the licence are used during the execution of the Licensed Activity and that all materials, substances or objects used during the execution of the works are inert and do not contain toxic elements which may be harmful to the marine environment, the living resources which it supports or human health.
- 3.1.3. The Licensee must remove all materials used in temporary construction listed in Part 2 of the licence before the expiry date of this licence. This licence shall not continue in force after the expiry date of 17 December 2021.
- 3.1.4. The Licensee must ensure that any debris or waste materials arising during the course of the works are removed from the site of the works for disposal at an approved location above the tidal level of Mean High Water Springs.
- 3.1.5. The Licensee must ensure that a copy of this licence is given to each contractor appointed to carry out part or all of the works in order that they are clear about the extent of 'the works' for which consent has been given and the conditions that are attached to the consent.
- 3.1.5 The Licensee must at all times construct and maintain the Licensed Activity in accordance with the licence, the application and the plans and programmes approved by the Licensing Authority.
- 3.1.6 All conditions attached to the licence bind any person who for the time being owns, occupies or enjoys any use of the works, whether or not this licence has been transferred to that person.
- 3.1.7 In the event of any breach of health and safety or environmental obligations relating to the Licensed Activity during the period of the licence, the Licensee must provide written notification of the nature and timing of the incident to the Licensing Authority within 24 hours of the incident occurring. Confirmation of remedial measures taken and/or to be taken to rectify the breach must be provided, in writing, to the Licensing Authority within a period of time to be agreed by the Licensing Authority.

3.2 Prior to the commencement of the Licensed Activity

- 3.2.1. The Licensee must ensure that HM Coastguard, in this case nmoccontroller@hmcg.gov.uk, The National Maritime Operations Centre is made aware of the works prior to Commencement.
- 3.2.2. The Licensee must consult with the responsible local navigation authority and the Harbour Authority/Commissioners where appropriate, who may wish to issue local warnings to alert those navigating in the vicinity to the presence of the works during the construction.

3.3 During the Licensed Activity

- 3.3.1. The Licensee must ensure appropriate steps are taken to minimise damage to the riverbank by the works.
- 3.3.2. The Licensee must ensure the riverbank is returned to the original profile, or as close as reasonably practicable, following the completion of the works.
- 3.3.3. The Licensee must ensure suitable bunding and storage facilities are employed to prevent the release of fuel oils, lubricating fluids associated with the plant and equipment into the marine environment.
- 3.3.4. If it is desired to display any marks or lights not required by this licence then details must be submitted to the Northern Lighthouse Board and their ruling complied with. The display of unauthorised marks or lights is prohibited.
- 3.3.5. Any jack up barges and vessels utilised during the works when jacked up, must exhibit signals in accordance with the UK Standard Marking Schedule for Offshore Installations / must exhibit the standard lights and shapes as per the International Regulations for the Prevention of Collisions at Sea.
- 3.3.6. The Licensee must ensure that the works are maintained at all times in good repair.
- 3.3.7. The Licensee must ensure that no deviation from the schedule specified in the licence is made without the further written consent of the Licensing Authority.
- 3.3.8. The Licensee must ensure that no radio beacon or radar beacon operating in the marine frequency bands is installed or used on the works without the prior written approval of the Licensing Authority.
- 3.3.9. If governmental assistance is required (including UK governmental assistance or the assistance of any UK devolved government) to deal with any emergency arising from:
- a) the failure to mark and light the works as required by this licence;
- b) the maintenance of the works or
- c) the drifting or wreck of the works,

to include the broadcast of navigational warnings, then the Licensee is liable for any expenses incurred in securing such assistance.

- 3.3.10. In the event of the Licensed Activity being discontinued the works must be removed and the site cleared to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority.
- 3.3.11. The Licensee must remove the works from below the level of Mean High Water Springs, or such alterations

made, within one month of notice being given by the Licensing Authority at any time it is considered necessary or advisable for the safety of navigation, and not replaced without further consent by the Licensing Authority. The Licensee shall be liable for any expense incurred.

- 3.3.12. Any person authorised by the Licensing Authority must be permitted to inspect the works at any reasonable time.
- 3.3.13. The Licensee must ensure that copies of the licence are available for inspection by any authorised Enforcement Officer at:
- a) the premises of the Licensee;
- b) the premises of any agent acting on behalf of the Licensee; and
- c) the site of the works.
- 3.3.14. In the event of the Licensee becoming aware that any of the information on which the issue of the licence was based has changed, the Licensing Authority must be immediately notified of the details.

3.4 Upon Completion of the Licensed Activity

3.4.1. The Licensee must submit a written report regarding the materials used during construction to the Licensing Authority. The written report must be submitted on completion of the works and on the forms provided by the Licensing Authority no later than 31 October 2022.
