1. PART 1 - GENERAL

1.1 Interpretation

In the licence, terms are as defined in Section 1, 64 and 157 of the Marine Scotland Act 2010, and

- a) **"the 2010 Act"** means the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010;
- b) **"Licensed Activity"** means any activity or activities listed in section 21 of the 2010 Act which is, or are authorised under the licence;
- c) **"Licensee"** means Seagreen Wind Energy Limited
- d) **"Mean High Water Springs"** means any area submerged at mean high water spring tide;
- e) **"Commencement of the Licensed Activity"** means the date on which the first vehicle or vessel arrives on the site to begin carrying on any activities in connection with the Licensed Activity;
- f) **"Completion of the Licensed Activity"** means the date on which the Licensed Activity has been installed in full, or the Licensed Activity has been deemed complete by the Licensing Authority, whichever occurs first;

All geographical co-ordinates contained within the licence are in WGS84 format (latitude and longitude degrees and minutes to three decimal places) unless otherwise stated.

1.3 Other authorisations and consents

The Licensee is deemed to have satisfied itself that there are no barriers or restrictions, legal or otherwise, to the carrying on of the Licensed Activities in connection with the licensed activity. The issuing of the licence does not absolve the Licensee from obtaining such other authorisations and consents, which may be required under statute.

1.4 Variation, suspension, revocation and transfer

Under section 30 (1) of the 2010 Act the Licensing Authority may by notice vary, suspend or revoke the licence granted by them if it appears to the Licensing Authority that there has been a breach of any of its provisions. For any such other reason that appears to be relevant to the Licensing Authority under section 30(2) or (3) of the 2010 Act. Under the 2010 Act variations, suspensions, revocations and transfers of licences are subject to the procedures set out in section 31 of the Act.

Under section 30 (7) of the 2010 Act, on an application made by a licensee, the Licensing Authority may vary a licence if satisfied that the variation being applied for is not material.

Under section 30 (8) of the 2010 Act, on an application made by the licensee, the Licensing Authority may transfer the licence from the Licensee to another person.

1.5 Breach of requirement for, or conditions of, licence

Under section 39 of the 2010 Act it is an offence to carry on a Licensable Marine Activity without a marine licence and it is also an offence to fail to comply with any condition of a marine licence.

1.6 Defences: actions taken in an emergency

Under section 40 of the 2010 Act it is a defence for a person charged with an offence under section 39(1) of the 2010 Act in relation to any activity to prove that –
the activity was carried out for the purpose of saving life, or for the purpose of securing the safety of a vessel, aircraft or marine structure ('force majeure'), and
that the person took steps within a reasonable time to inform the Licensing Authority as set out in section 40(2) of the 2010 Act.

1.7 Offences relating to information

Under section 42 of the 2010 Act it is an offence for a person to make a statement which is false or misleading in a material way, knowing the statement to be false or misleading or being reckless as to whether the statement is false or misleading, or to intentionally fail to disclose any material information for the purpose of procuring the issue, variation or transfer of a marine licence or for the purpose of complying with, or purporting to comply with, any obligation imposed by either Part 4 of the 2010 Act or the provisions of this licence.

1.8 Appeals

Under Regulation 3(1) of the Marine Licensing Appeals (Scotland) Regulations 2011 a person who has applied for a marine licence may by summary application appeal to against a decision taken by the Licensing Authority under section 71(1)(b) or (c) or (5) of the Act.

2.3 Description of the Licensed Activity

The Works consist of the removal of four anchors from the nearshore area of the Seagreen Windfarm export cables.

As described in the application dated 03 June, 2025 and correspondence submitted in support of the application.

2.4 Descriptions of the substances or objects to be removed

The licence authorises the removal of the undernoted substances and objects required in connection with the licensed activity, subject to the maximum amounts as specified below:

No. 4 steel/iron anchors - up to 1500 kilograms per anchor.

3. PART 3 – CONDITIONS

3.1 General Conditions

3.1.1 The Licensee must provide written notification of any serious unforeseen incident of harm to the environment or human health, or any serious unforeseen incident of interference with legitimate uses of the sea during the Licensed Activity, to the Licensing Authority within 24 hours of the incident occurring.

3.1.2 The Licensee must notify the UK Hydrographic Office at sdr@ukho.gov.uk of the following information:

- a) no less than 10 days prior to the Commencement of the Licensed Activity
 - i) the start date of the Licensed Activity and proposed end date
 - ii) a description of the Licensed Activity
 - iii) details of any aids to navigation
 - iv) location of the area of the Licensed Activity (latitude and longitude coordinates in WGS84 (ETRS89) datum)
 - v) a copy of the Licence
- b) the progress of the Licensed Activity
- c) no later than 10 working days after the Completion of the Licensed Activity
 - i) the date of Completion of the Licensed Activity
 - ii) details of new or changed aids to navigation

A copy of the notification in a) and c) must be sent to the Licensing Authority within five working days of the notification being sent.

3.1.3 If governmental assistance is required (including UK governmental assistance or the assistance of any UK devolved government) to deal with any emergency arising from:

- a) the failure to mark and light the Works as required by the licence;
- b) the maintenance of the Works; or
- c) the drifting or wreck of the Works,

to include the broadcast of navigational warnings, then the Licensee is liable for any expenses incurred in securing such assistance.

3.1.4 The Licensee must adopt measures to prevent the introduction and spread of invasive non-native species as a result of the Licensed Activity.

3.1.5 The Licensee must ensure that the Licensed Activity is only carried out at the location of the Licensed Activity specified in Part 2 of the licence.

3.1.6 No Works must be undertaken within 2 kilometres of a designated bathing water between 15 May and 15 September without the prior written approval of the Licensing Authority in consultation with the Scottish Environment Protection Agency.

3.1.7 There must be no Commencement of the Licensed Activity until the Licensee has agreed a Communications Protocol with respect to Danger Area D604 - Barry Buddon, with the Ministry of Defence.

The Licensee must implement and adhere to the agreed Communications Protocol for the duration of the Licensed Activity.

The Licensee must notify the Ministry of Defence of the commencement, progress and completion of the Licensed Activity, at timelines agreed with the Ministry of Defence within the Communications Protocol.

3.1.8 The Licensed Activity or any other activity carried out in connection with or in consequence of the Licensed Activity must not conflict with Ministry of Defence activities at Ministry of Defence Danger Area D604 - Barry Buddon for the duration of the Licensed Activity.

3.2 Prior to the commencement of the Licensed Activity

3.2.1 The Licensee must notify the Licensing Authority in writing of the name and address of any agent, contractor or sub-contractor not already listed in Part 2 of the licence being used to carry out any Licensed Activity listed in Part 2 of the licence. Such notification must be received by the Licensing Authority no less than 24 hours before the commencement of the Licensed Activity

3.2.2 The Licensee must provide the name and address of any agent, contractor or sub-contractor proposed to be engaged in the activity to the Licensing Authority prior to the Commencement of the Licensed Activity.

3.2.3 The Licensee must issue local notification to marine users, including the Northern Lighthouse Board (navigation@nlb.org.uk), fisher's organisations, neighbouring port authorities and other local stakeholders, of the commencement of the Licensed Activity at least five days before the Commencement of the Licensed Activity.

The Licensing Authority must be sent a copy of the notification within 24 hours of the notification being sent.

3.2.4 The Licensee must notify HM Coastguard National Maritime Operations Centre (nmoccontroller@hmcg.gov.uk), HM Coastguard (Zone4@hmcg.gov.uk and renewables@hmcg.gov.uk), The Maritime and Coastguard Agency (GlasgowMO@mcga.gov.uk), no less than 7 days prior to the Commencement of the Licensed Activity, of the following information:

a) the start date and proposed end date of the Licensed Activity.

A copy of the notification must be sent to the Licensing Authority within five working days of the notification being sent.

3.2.5 The Licensee must contact the local statutory harbour authority, in this case Forth Ports Dundee, prior to Commencement of the Licensed Activity.

3.3 During the Licensed Activity

3.3.1 Only those persons acting on behalf of, and authorised by, the agent or the Licensee shall undertake the Licensed Activity.

3.3.2 The Licensee must ensure that any debris or waste materials arising during the course of the Licensed Activity are removed for disposal at an approved location above the tidal level of Mean High Water Springs.

3.3.3 The Licensee must ensure that a copy of the licence is available for inspection by a Marine Enforcement Officer at:

- a) the premises of the Licensee;
- b) the premises of any agent, contractor and sub-contractor engaged in the Licensed Activity;
- c) location of the Licensed Activity;
- d) any vessel or vehicle carrying on the Licensed Activity.

3.3.4 The Licensee must provide a copy of the licence to each agent, contractor and sub-contractor engaged in the Licensed Activity and must ensure that any person engaged in the Licensed Activity is aware of the particulars in Part 2 of the licence and the conditions in Part 3 of the licence.

3.3.5 The Licensee must minimise suspension of sediment and minimise damage to the seabed when carrying on the Licensed Activity.

3.3.6 The Licensee must ensure appropriate steps are taken to minimise damage to the seabed during the Licensed Activity.

3.3.7 Any person authorised by the Licensing Authority must be permitted to inspect the site at any reasonable time.

3.3.8 The Licensee must ensure that all personnel adhere to the Scottish Marine Wildlife Watching Code, where appropriate, for the duration of the Licensed Activity.

3.4 Upon Completion of the Licensed Activity

3.4.1 If a new licence is required, the Licensee must make an application at least fourteen weeks before the expiry date of the licence. This licence shall not continue in force after the expiry date of 04 September 2026.

3.4.2 The seabed must be returned as close as reasonably practicable to the original profile following completion of the Licensed Activity unless otherwise agreed in writing with Licensing Authority.

2. In the event that the licensee wishes any of the particulars set down in the Schedule to be altered, the licensing authority must be immediately notified of the alterations. It should be noted that changes can invalidate a licence, and that an application for a new licence may be necessary.
