DECISION NOTICE RELATIVE TO APPLICATION FOR MULTI-STAGE REGULATORY APPROVAL

CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATION OF THE OFFSHORE TRANSMISSION INFRASTRUCTURE RELATIVE TO THE SEAGREEN ALPHA OFFSHORE WIND FARM AND THE SEAGREEN BRAVO OFFSHORE WIND FARM LOCATED IN THE FIRTH OF FORTH

1. Description of the Application

On 10 October 2014 the Scottish Ministers, granted in favour of Seagreen Alpha Wind Energy Limited (Company Number 07185533) and Seagreen Bravo Wind Energy Limited (Company Number 07185543), both having its registered office previously at 55 Vastern Road, Reading, Berkshire and both now at No. 1 Forbury Place, 43 Forbury Road, Reading ("the Companies"), jointly a marine licence under part 4 of the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010 and Marine and Coastal







Access Act 2009 relative to the above works. The said marine licence was subsequently varied by the Scottish Ministers on 6 March 2019 ("the marine licence"). Condition 3.2.3.2 of the marine licence requires the Companies to submit a Offshore Transmission Asset Operations and Maintenance Programme ("OTA OMP") for approval by the Scottish Ministers prior to commencing the above works.

1.1 On 24 March 2022 the Companies submitted to the Scottish Ministers the OTA OMP for approval and applied for multi-stage regulatory approval in relation thereto and in accordance with condition 3.2.3.2 of the marine licence.

2. Reasons and Considerations on which this decision is based

- 2.1 Following consultation with Angus Council, Dundee City Council, East Lothian Council, Fife Council, East Lothian Council, Scottish Borders Council, NatureScot, the Ministry of Defence, the Maritime Coastguard Agency, the Northern Lighthouse Board and the Scottish Environment Protection Agency, an amended OTA OMP was submitted to the Scottish Ministers by the Companies on 18 May 2022.
- 2.2 The information contained in the OTA OMP is within the parameters of what has already been assessed within the Environmental Statement, the Addendum and the Erratum submitted in respect of the marine licence.
- 2.3 The Companies were not required to submit additional information under regulation 27 of the Marine Works (Environmental Impact Assessment) (Scotland) Regulations 2017 in relation to the application for multi-stage regulatory approval.

3. Determination and Terms of Decision

- The Scottish Ministers, hereby approve the OTA OMP as submitted on 18 May 2022 and grant multi-stage regulatory approval in relation thereto.
- 3.2 In the event that the Companies wish to update or amend the OTA OMP, the Companies must submit, in writing, details of the proposed updates or amendments to the Scottish Ministers for their written approval prior to the planned implementation of the proposed updates or amendments. It is not permissible for any works associated with the proposed updates or amendments to proceed prior to the granting of such approval.
- 3.3 Unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Scottish Ministers, all works must proceed in accordance with the OTA OMP.
