Good Morning,

Thank you for consulting JNCC in regard to the Beatrice Offshore Windfarm, which we received on 10/06/2026.

JNCC's role in relation to offshore renewables in Scottish waters has been delegated to NatureScot.

NatureScot is now authorised to exercise the JNCC's functions as a statutory consultee in respect of certain applications for offshore renewable energy installations in inshore and offshore waters (0-200nm) adjacent to Scotland.

As operations are fully inshore and not in or located near a marine protected area NatureScot should provide a full response.

As such JNCC have not reviewed this document and will not be providing further comment.

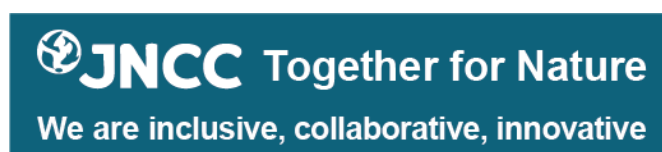

Beatrice Offshore Windfarm Limited, having received consent under the above legislation has submitted to the licensing authority the attached revised Project Environmental Monitoring Programme (“PEMP”).

The purpose of the revised PEMP is to satisfy the requirements of:

- condition 27 of section 36 consent awarded to Beatrice Offshore Windfarm Limited on 19 March 2014;
