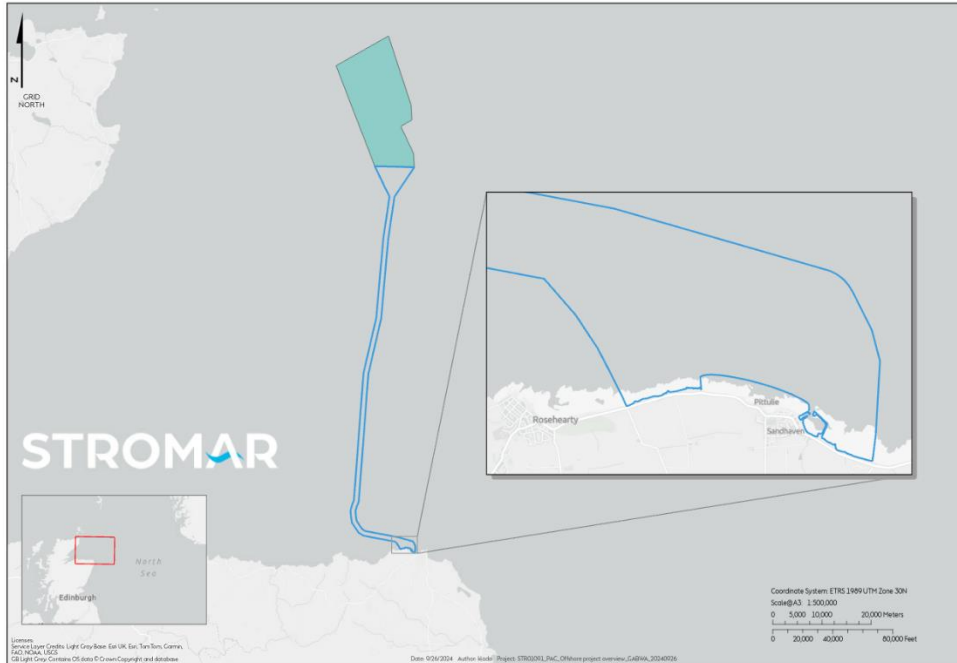


**Stromar Offshore Wind Limited  
Marine (Scotland) Act 2010  
The Marine Licence (Pre-application Consultation) (Scotland) Regulations 2013**

Notice is hereby given that Stromar Offshore Wind Limited (company no: SC716924 – 2nd Floor 2 Lochrin Square, 96 Fountainbridge, Edinburgh, Scotland, EH3 9QA) plans to hold pre-application consultation events regarding proposed licensable marine activities within the Scottish Territorial Waters.



The proposed Stromar Offshore Wind Farm will be a floating windfarm located approximately 80 km north of Fraserburgh and key offshore components of the proposed project are:

- Up to 100 wind turbines with floating foundations, within the array area shown indicatively shaded green in the above figure.
- Up to three offshore substations in the offshore array area (shaded green in the above figure) linked to the wind turbines via inter-array cables.
- Up to one offshore platform known as the offshore Reactive Compensation Station (RCS) likely to be positioned midway along the offshore export cables.
- Up to three export cables connecting the offshore substations in the offshore array area to the north Aberdeenshire coast, via the route shown indicatively by the blue solid line on the above figure.
- Other associated activities including scour and cable protection activities.

Central grid references for the proposed offshore development are:

- Center point of wind farm array area: 2°8'45"W 58°30'52"N
- Center point of landfall west option: 2°5'14"W 57°42'N
- Center point of landfall east option: 2°3'4"W 57°41'41"N

The pre-application consultation events will be held at the times and locations below. These drop-in events will provide an opportunity for members of the public and stakeholders to consider and comment on the proposed project.
