Canmore ID	Name	Description
313238	<i>Scottish Queen</i>	A steam trawler built in 1889. It was reportedly sunk by gunfire from the German submarine U-39.
313790	<i>Duva</i>	Formerly named <i>Brook</i> was built in 1913 in Grangemouth. <i>Duva</i> was abandoned on 14 November and sank on 17 November 1926, '55 miles south-east 0.5 miles east of Aberdeen'.
328826	Titan	A trawler built in Grimsby in 1903. It was reportedly sunk by a submarine '74 miles north- east of Longstone'.
314131	Svein Jarl	A steel steamship built in 1909 in Trondheim, Norway. It was reportedly torpedoed '75 miles north-east of Longstone'.
322395/32511	A/C Sikorsky	Crashed into the sea on 14 November 1970 while en route from Dyce Airport to Oil Rig Staflo. It is possible the helicopter floated for a while before sinking.
322396	A/C Phantom	Crashed on 4 August 1978. Wreckage was sighted by a helicopter en route to an oil rig but was impossible to relocate due to visibility. Later, in 1983, wreckage identified as being from a RAF Phantom was brought up by a trawler, but no further information is available.
